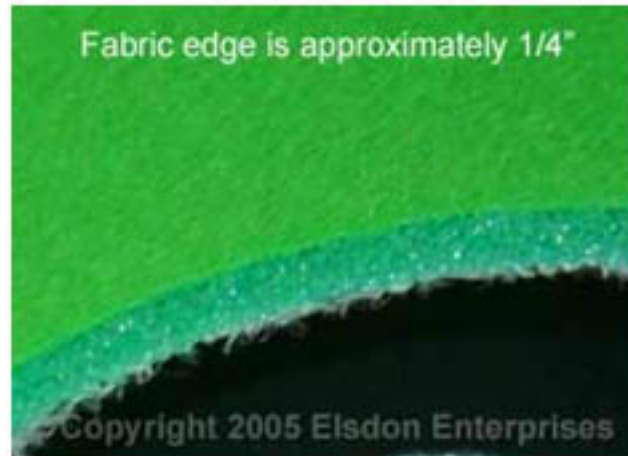

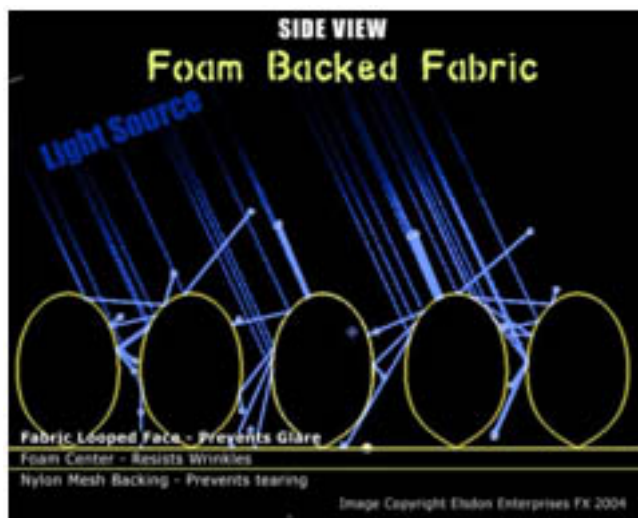
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- Light Diffusing Surface

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Chroma keying is a technique used in video production to replace a solid color background with another image or video.

The most common color used for chroma keying is blue, but green is also frequently used.

There are several factors that can affect the quality of a chroma key, including the color of the background and the quality of the camera and lighting.
